- iefly restate your main points. If you ca is in one sentence, do so.

Aim to sound authoritative, believable, and napologetic--believe that people want to hear our ideas!

and with some pizzazz. Pay careful attention our very last sentence--perhaps include echnique such as emphasize a key idea, add rasight, or refer back to the beginning.

Leep it short and sweet!

LIIIYY LO AVOID

- Don't introduce new ideas. If they are important, nclude them in your earlier paragraphs.
- Don't be unbalanced--instead carefully acknowled each of your paragraphs or ideas.
- Don't summarize by repeating previous sentences vord-for-word. Give a new twist to your thoughts
- Don't go on and on... A conclusion should only be ines long.
